Pupil Premium funding is a grant given to schools to support pupils in the school who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) or who are Children Looked After by the Local Authority (CLA).

Expenditure will be monitored on a termly basis, reporting to governors on the benefits the funding has had to pupils, and the learning outcomes.

The funding will be used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and to raise the standard of achievement for the eligible students.

The funding will be used to narrow the achievement gap for the eligible pupils.

The funding will be used to resource the delivery of key initiatives to enable and sustain focussed support to raise standards in literacy, numeracy, PSHE and communication skills. The key initiatives will include:

- Thriving Reading Programme – intervention programme aimed at raising achievement in reading.
- First Class @ Number programme to improve targeted pupils skills in number
- Intervention groups - to support KS2 SATs for FSM children
- 1:1 tuition – to narrow the attainment gap for CLA and FSM children.
- To fund a creative practitioner to enrich the curriculum, particularly developing children's opportunity for writing and communication skills.
- I pads (class teacher and pupil I pads) to enable ICT to be used effectively to support learning and engagement
