

## PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT

### Planned Expenditure for September 2014- July 2015

Pupil Premium funding is a grant given to schools to support pupils in the school who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) or who are Children Looked After by the Local Authority (CLA). The Pupil Premium is additional funding which the school receives in order to close any attainment gap between free school meal pupils and non-free school meal pupils. Expenditure will be monitored on a termly basis, reporting to governors on the benefits the funding has had to pupils, and the learning outcomes.

The funding will be used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and to raise the standard of achievement for the eligible students.

The funding will be used to resource the delivery of key initiatives to enable and sustain focussed support to raise standards in literacy, numeracy, PSHE and communication skills. The key initiatives will include:

- Thriving Reading Programme – intervention programme aimed at raising achievement in reading.
- Learning Mentor focus on Play Therapy which will support the social and emotional needs of pupils ensuring that all pupils make expected levels of progress within their band of leaning (Durham).
- Intervention groups - to support KS2 SATs for FSM children
- 1:1 tuition – to ensure that there is no attainment gaps for CLA and FSM children.
- Additional Educational Psychologist advice to ensure that targeted pupils receive specialist intervention programmes and their needs are effectively met.
- Targeted intervention in Maths and English to further raise standards.

- Summative assessments
- PASS (Pupil attitude to self)

#### Year 7 Catch Up Premium 2014/15
